For the SA Ticket Office, the computers are really old and they want to upgrade their software to do ticketing for us. I talked to CIT and the model they recommended is a business model so if something breaks it's easy to fix. And for AC we have 2 computers in the office, the one on the right is newer and the one on the left is a little older and they have problems with it.

Will says I have seen the computers and they are obnoxiously slow and especially since Ke\$ha ticket sales will be coming up we need this.

Doug says I recently observed the AC computer in action and I wanted to gouge my eyes out.

I forgot to mention that the model that is recommended is in the NYS contract so it would be even cheaper.

Open Discussion

Liz Seager: Thank you for having me it is an honor. I did speak to IRC last Monday. I was asked to talk about the services that our office provides to students and to talk about how you take your student organizations and whatnot and sell them on a resume. The services that people seem to request most often from our office would be resumes, internships, and jobs. In addition to some of the things that you just mentioned I am going to leave a little brochure that lists all of our services here. Anything that is employment related we are here to assist you with. Also anything to do with grad school and placement files. You can call our office and schedule a 45 minute appointment with a counselor. We will talk to you about whatever you need to discuss. Whatever we can do to help you find a major or a career path, we do job searching, strategizing, or anything you need. We have drop in hours, you just need a resume, a cover letter, and any questions about grad school. We also offer job postings. I can tell you who is coming on campus, or what kind of jobs I'm collecting resumes for. You can also go in and use Knightjobs to search for jobs yourself. You all have an account in Knightjobs you just have to get into the system if you haven't been before. Once you're in you can look for mentors, jobs, interviews, career events, etc. We use it also for on campus recruiting functions. For grad school counseling we have lots of materials in our office that can help you. We can also help you with a placement file process. This is something you use if you go onto grad school or you're

potentially an education major. It holds up to 8 letters of written letters of recommendation, a copy of your resume, and a copy of your transcript. It costs \$10 to set up a placement file, and it lives in our office for 20 years. Every time you want it set out it costs \$4. In 5 years we hope to convert it all into an electronic database. We can help you with a personal statement. We have a career resource library which holds over 300 resources, books for every major except for philosophy. We had a whole show today about working in environmental fields in honor of the Live Green campaign going on. We have Geneseo career partners, which is a database of about 400 alumni that volunteered to be career based people for you that can help.

Jake: When I was a freshman and sophomore I didn't have a job so I went on the site. It helped me to find some odd jobs to bring in money.

Doug: Yeah it can also help you to find a career, like me.

Liz: There are a lot of community members that trust the students to help them do things. Now I will talk about resumes. When you look at these experiences they can be categorized in many different places. If your student organization experience is oriented towards a career goal it can go to one place, but if it isn't then it can go somewhere else. First of all you have to figure out the skills that you've developed. Do an analysis of do I have a job description that I can tap into, or ask myself what I do on a monthly or daily basis with this organization? Some questions to ask yourself is what kind of leadership responsibilities do you have, what kind of collaborative experiences have I participated in, what kind of duties do I have, what activities have helped my verbal and written communication skills, do I mentor people, can I teach a skill, or do I supervise others? Today I brought a handout that I use in resume writing workshops. You can write about a full time job, a part time job, a leadership experience, just make sure you write about it in action statements. They are strong direct statements that demonstrate skills that you can offer a potential employer. You need to make an impact and make it quickly. Incomplete sentences help a lot. You want statements to start with an action verb. In your resumes you can be accomplishment oriented. Emphasize any new learning. Earlier this week I got onto the SA website to see what they're up to. Their job descriptions are written in language that can go on their resumes. Every description had action statements, they were all very well written. Doug I'm going to pick on you. You have two statements that you said, "is a member" and "is a delegate". That's fine for the website but if you want to make it into "member of" and "delegate of". Just a tiny bit of editing. If you're a dish washer you cannot say that you're a dish engineer, but you can say that you're reliable and efficient. That's the way to market that position without tripping your way into saying you're a dish engineer.

Doug says that was a very comprehensive presentation, I know I brought my resume to you and you helped me out. Thank you very much that was fantastic. I hereby reinstate Robert's Rules. Don't start something or else I'm calling Robert. Tabled business is remaining tabled.
