Jill says from April 8th-10th at SUNY Binghamton our yearly conference will be taking place. We did attend last year and everyone had a great time and brought a lot back for us to use and to be creative with. We'd like to go again. We see all the logistics as far as cost goes. We'd really like to push for this conference because there are so many workshops available. I have the schedule here. For example one workshop is being friends with and working with gang violence in the community. Another is challenging stereotypes from lesbians to gay jocks. It's definitely not narrow as far as information goes we have about 17 people going so we could all split up and go to different workshops at different times and get as much out of this as possible. I want to address a few things in the rationale that aren't correct. For lodging it says we are staying at the Howard Johnson. We are staying at the Hampton Inn Suites. Howard Johnson was un-refundable. Under meals it says that we reduced our request. We requested the full amount of \$15. Fatima Johnson has agreed to be our chaperone for the conference.

Mary asks as a logistics question, title of the conference is at Northeastern but it says that your destination is Binghamton?

Jill says under the conference it's supposed to say it's at a northeastern university, as in a university in the northeast.

Will asks considering we have spring break, the 23rd is when the funds would be approved, so is 2 weeks enough to register?

Jill says as far as we know it would be enough time according to all the sources we've checked. There isn't a registration cutoff; it goes about 2 hours into the conference itself. We only need to push it a little faster because of the hotel.

Mark says for the room rate, you have \$135.55. When I checked/Kate checked, we found out that its \$109.

Jill says okay.

Kate asks with the Zip car, how is that going to work? Are there enough? In the rationale I thought it read that you are getting one?
Jill says yes we are renting 3. I am a driver and a fourth student has his own car that he will let us use.
Doug asks where are you getting the third Zip car as we only have 2 on campus?
Jill says we have been talking with Fatima and I think she is letting us use her car to transport students.
Will says I know for at least Model UN we've used rental cars from the local enterprise dealership. That might even be cheaper and people's licenses.
Tom says also I know that at one of the conferences we went to Fatima drove one of the school cars; I don't know if we're allowed to do that.
Kate says if she is an approved driver, she has to be certified.
Tom says look into that.
Jill says she wasn't sure about reservations.
Tom says I think that this is a good way to reach out and meet a lot of different schools. From going to a few different LGBT conferences I know we've gotten so much material to use for Pride meetings so have a great time and you'll learn a lot.
