Open Discussion

Heather says I heard that there was something passed at ACE today that was controversial regarding a comedian. I wanted to bring that to the floor so people can comment on it.

Sadie says I wish that I was here to bear better news. ACE passed a reading today, it was a really close vote, to spend \$2000 to bring Danny Cho to Geneseo, and Pride Alliance and several other ACE groups were very opposed to this because he has in the past made a lot of statements that are highly offensive to women, to minorities, to disabled people, and to gay people. That's why we think he shouldn't come. I have some tweets that I will read from him and some excerpts from his blog posts. A lot of them are really lewd and sexual and incredibly offensive and if you think you are going to be uncomfortable you might want to leave the room. (11 tweets were read but were not quoted in the minutes).

After this, members of ACE sent Danny Cho an email asking him to not make any comments like that when he comes to Geneseo, which I do not trust because I read his most recent comments about a show that he had. It was derogatory towards African Americans. Nick asks how many of you would like to see this performer not come to this campus?

Tommy says that is an extremely compelling argument that would make anyone agree that he shouldn't come. But there is probably another side. There are steps to be made to make this performance better, maybe to ask for a set list. I would still be curious to hear the other side of the comments.

Charles says even if he is totally clean here I don't want to support someone who puts that stuff out publicly. If he says that, we shouldn't support him or give him a cent.

A representative says I'm all for artistic expression and I'm not a fan of censorship, I feel like we stand for something here that he does not. I am reading his blog and I don't think that it is a good idea for him to come.

Nick says I am interested in any opposing comments to the discussion we have already had here.

A representative says I agree with what you just said. I think that Geneseo stands for something; it's an open, safe, and accepting community. If he comes, that completely contradicts everything that Geneseo could stand for and something that a lot of groups on campus have been trying to fight for.

A representative says I haven't heard him and Sadie's argument seems valid because it seems like he says a lot of rude things. But comedians are known for not being very sensitive. There was one comedian that I know that made a joke about how children are beaten but it didn't have anything to do with child abuse. I can't stand up for this guy because I have never heard his jokes but I do know that a lot of comedians are like that.

A representative says I think it's different if you have a blog and you are saying stuff on a blog all the time, then it seems like you actually feel that way. A lot of times comedians are trying to get a reaction from a room, so if he is posting these things on his blog he is trying to get a message across.

Heather says whether or not he feels the way that it appears he does on his blog, I still don't think that he should come here because the ideas in his blog has things directly against people who speak out about being bullied. Just putting the ideas out there is what Geneseo stands out against. He is just bashing all of these people who are bashed by society on a daily basis. I'm not okay with this money going towards this man even showing up here.

Elliot says comedians are going to say controversial stuff, it would be great to have a comedian come here but we can have controversial humor and not be tasteless.

Tyler says I'm a man who definitely appreciates comedy but having read this, I never knew about this guy before today, this is not the sign of someone who is funny but someone who is little in this world that needs to make comments like that. I do not want someone to come here and spit on what students at this college stand for.

A representative says he has come here before and I had no idea who he was and I went to see him, and I was completely appalled at some of the stuff he was saying. There also weren't a lot of people there so we were spending money on a poor performer that wasn't well attended.
