Updates

President, Forrest Regan updates: Last Friday was the first stipend period due, so for all of you who have stipend reports I would like to say, good job doing that. I also want to remind everyone who sent to my SA President Account, saprps@geneseo.edu, that if you didn't get a response from me it may have gotten lost in my personal account, which fills quickly. We had our SA Retreat this past weekend. We went to Conesus Lake and talked about some plans and initiatives we will be starting this year. So, you will start hearing about new things that came out of that. As far as USAEC and Student Court, I have appointed the USAEC Chair and there are extra positions on the committee, so Kevin Callery, sitting up front here, is looking for others to come help him out. If anyone is interested in one of those positions, please come see me or Kevin for more information about that. I updated my office hours today, I will no longer be holding office hours on Tuesday and Wednesday. I moved them to Monday and Thursday. So, Thursday is from 1pm to 4:30pm. Also, last Monday we had our annual audit. For those of you who don't know, the auditors go through all of our accounts and minutes to make sure no one is doing anything fraudulent or anything. After that, they give us a report on how our books are looking and this year it looked pretty good. In this report is how much we have in Reserves, which is very beneficial for everyone to know. We have gone from having at the end of 2012 \$608,000 in net assets and now, at the end of the 2012-2013 academic year we have \$787,744 in net assets. The audits are available for anyone who would like to look at them. They are confusing at first but interesting to someone who understands what all the numbers mean. If you ever are interested in seeing how much money SA has, has spent, or what the money is being spent on you may stop in the SA Office and ask for an audit and someone can walk you through it.

Vice-President, Katie Becker updates: As a reminder to club sports, the anti-hazing presentations are coming up. The first one will be on Friday September 20th at 2:30pm in CU 322 and another on Sunday September 22nd at 2:30pm in CU 322. Please make sure your new members attend these. We had the first meeting of the SOFI Task Force and it went well since we had some good discussion. The next meeting I will announce closer to the meeting date. We are trying to get the Director of Institutional Research to come and talk to us as well. I will be announcing that information sooner if you are interested. Last week I mentioned the Chancellor's Award; I'm still looking for an individual assistant on that committee to go to different classes to observe and to put a package together for SUNY Central. Lastly, I need to see Crew and Ski Team at the end of the meeting today.

Director of Business Affairs, Rob Terreri updates: First off, if Guitar Club is here you have missed two meetings, you are in bad financial standing and your budget has been frozen. We need to talk after this meeting. Other than that, if your president or treasurers have missed officer training they need to contact me as soon as possible to reschedule for training. Now, the NCC is responsible for preparing delegations to go to conferences at the regional and national level and they are also responsible for keeping Geneseo up-to-date with all the things going on in NEACURH and the National Association of College and University Residence Halls. Otherwise, the letters of intent are due by October 4th and the elections will be held at the IRC meeting on Monday October 7th.

Director of Public Relations, Riley Burchell updates: I did mention this last week, but just a reminder that tomorrow from 3pm to 4pm is the first Student Issues Public Forum of the semester. Like I said before, any concerns or praises or any other topics you have please come voice them in a relaxed, non-judgmental atmosphere. We can just talk and hang out and play around with some new promo items, like these little seed planters. The planters are "24-hour acting", which was no extra charge. Professor Greenfield will be attending the English Club meeting September 30th at 7pm in Welles 115 to sing. Also, History Club will be hosting a Grad School panel on October 2nd at 2:30pm. They did not tell me a location yet for the panel, but I will relay this information at the next meeting. Finally, this Friday at 4pm Melissa Hull, a Geneseo Alumn who directed one of the plays last year, will be holding a talk about her work in the theatre business.

Director of Student Affairs, Bruno Villazhinay updates: This past weekend we had the ACE Film Festival and it was a great success. Over 100 people attended, so thank you to all those who came and thank you for helping me advertise this event. We also had another ACE meeting today and we were discussing the intercultural dinner. Some ACE clubs are already planning all their cultural dinners right now and our Intercultural Dinner will be Saturday November 9th. We have plenty of time before then, so people are welcome to come help if they want. Geneseo's Chinese Cultural Club will be having its Moon Cake Festival this Saturday at 5:30pm in the Saratoga Commons. It will be \$5 for non-members and \$3 for members. They will also be having a meeting tomorrow at 7:15pm in room 322 /323. LSA will be having a meeting tomorrow as well at 5pm in the Fireside Lounge to talk about soccer. The Japanese Culture Club will be having a meeting tomorrow too at 6pm in CU 322/323 and they will have a KnightSpot Game Night next Thursday from 6pm to 7pm. GAGG: This is about our annual convention, Running GAGG, which goes on every year and is at, I believe, number 17 and that is only since we have been counting. Every year we run Running GAGG it is a profitable venture. We are asking, as we do every year,

for money up front that we will pay back to SA with the money that we make at the event. It is more of a loan than simply asking for money in that respect. As far as the Tech/OT point, if you read it, it states we are having one extra late night event and we need to pay the Union manager and the Union employees more money to stay here longer. Also, we might need SA Tech, totaling the amount we need with the Union manager and employees at \$50.00. And as far as the Artist/Guest Speaker point, we don't know who we are going to have yet so we are asking for a significant sum. The unused portion of that sum will be returned of course along with paying the rest of it back. We have had a lot of great people over the years. I am not sure how many of you read web comics. We have had the guy who writes "Dr. McNinja", Dinosaur Comics attended, and all kinds of really great people. Katie Tiedrich came last year as well. We have a number of people who we're asking this year, but we are still unsure of who may actually be coming.

Forrest: Any questions for GAGG?

GAGG: Absolutely. As a matter of fact, the GAGG Alumni are usually the ones in charge of running the event. They sit behind the desk and sign everyone in and they know all the right people. This is why we have a much nicer, bigger convention than we have any right to because we have the alumni who know how to do it right and know all the right people. We are very grateful to them for all the effort and support.
